COMPULSORY PRE-REQUISITES

CONDUCT:	All PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS must abide by our Codes of Behaviour	
WWCC:	All team personnel aged 18 yrs & over must have a current Working With Children Check - umpires, coaches, team managers, volunteers, officials - click <u>here</u> for more information	
NETBALL VICTORIA MEMBERSHIP:	 Every player, coach & umpire must hold a NV State Membership before taking the court. This ensures that players, clubs/ teams & the Association are legally protected & have personal accident insurance. This fee is payable once a year only and provides cover for 12 months in ANY Netball Victoria affiliated competition. 100% of this fee is paid to Netball Victoria. Clubs will send all players & officials their specific club LINK to Netball Connect registration form. Players & officials will register to every competition in which they participate ie) Winter / Spring / Power - but they will only pay once a year. EXCEPTION: Year 3 players who have a group insurance package with Sportscover 	

COMPETITION Structure:

GAME TIMES:	• 4 x 10 min quarters; 2 min half time break; straight changeover at ¼ & ¾ time (no siren)
	No injury time due to central timing
DIVISIONS:	Divisions are based on school year level, not age
	Teams with players from more than 1 year level must enter in the higher level
GRADING:	Grading is based on school year, previous results, team lists and information provided by clubs
	The aims in Spring are to 1) challenge top teams 2) provide variety and 3) have fun
	There will be no re-grading during the season
	Note: as some teams do not play Spring and other teams combine, sections cannot be compared to Season 1**
CHRISTMAS	ALL TEAMS play in the Christmas Finale
FINALE:	 Yr 3 / 4 teams will play a round robin format with Santa visiting
See Page 7/8	• Yr 5 – open teams will play off based on final ladder positions ie) 1v2, 3v4, 5v6, 7v8 etc
Bylaws	Players must play at least 1 game in a team to qualify for finals
	If the team has less than 7 eligible players, a player from a lower section may fill in
	Players may only play in one finals match per day
FORFEITS:	In fairness to the opposition team, forfeiting is strongly discouraged.
See page 8 Bylaws	A "scratch match" using players from other teams will avoid a fine to the offending team.
	• A significant forfeit fine of \$100 will be imposed, UNLESS the Association admin@bna.org.au is
	advised no later than 2pm on the day before the game.
BYES:	We aim to have NO BYES in Spring

GENERAL INFORMATION

PLAYERS:	Please DO NOT enter the Spring Fling if you are unable to field a team EVERY WEEK .		
	 Consider rowing commitments, VCE exams, Races, school camps etc. Players may only be a member of ONE team / club. They can fill in for other teams but once they have played 3 games with a higher team, they cannot play with the lower again > see by-law 15 (a) Teams may only submit team entries with a minimum of 7 confirmed players. 		
	• Clubs may NOT have more than 3 teams in the same year level unless each team has a minimum of 10 confirmed players.		
GENDER:	No restrictions based on gender in primary school teams (as per legislation).		
	From Yr 7, all BNA competitions are classified as "MODIFIED MIXED"		
	❖ Maximum 0 - 3 males on the weekly team list		
	❖ Maximum 0 - 3 males on court at one time according to positions see by-laws.		
	Sections are based on skill level, not gender > please communicate this to your members / parents!		
UNIFORM:	All players must wear their club uniform unless specific exemptions are obtained.		
FIRST AID:	ALL clubs are required to carry their own first aid kits		
	The Association employs a registered nurse > available in the first aid room		
	 The Association does NOT provide tape / bandaids for earrings. 		

UMPIRING

Year 3 & 4	Each team must provide an umpire for their own game each week.	
	These umpires must have completed the on-line Netball Victoria Theory test.	
	As this section is <i>non-competitive</i> and the emphasis is on participation, skill development, learning	
	the rules and fun, umpires may be trainees / coaches / parents and are encouraged to coach / teach	
	the players whilst umpiring.	
	Guidelines for umpiring this level are available on our website here .	
Year 5 - 9	Each team is encouraged to nominate an umpire (incl. trainees) to umpire EVERY week for the panel.	
	There is an option to instead pay an UMPIRE LEVY of \$125; however our aim is to encourage	
	ongoing umpire development, not financial gain. If a team does not nominate an umpire, the team	
	will pay the Umpire Levy (ie 5 teams = 5 panel umpires each week)	
	The Association will roster <u>and pay</u> all umpires according to their availability form.	
	Umpires do not umpire their own team/club match.	
Year 10 +	ALL senior teams are required to provide one accredited umpire (badged or badge trainee) for senior	
	matches every second week (= 3 weeks).	
	• <u>Clubs</u> will provide umpires as such: <i>number <u>senior</u> teams x ½</i> .	
	[ie.10 senior teams = 5 umpires per week]	
	Clubs will pay umpires for these games at a rate negotiated between the team / club and umpire.	
	There is NO OPTION to pay the Umpire Incentive Payment in lieu of providing an umpire.	
	The Association will provide (and pay) all other umpires including umpires for finals.	
	We would prefer you NOT use MSI umpires as they are extremely costly & can be unreliable. It is	
	much more sustainable to develop your own umpires.	
ALL	All nominated team umpires must submit the on-line Umpire Registration and Availability form.	
	The Association will roster all umpires according to their Availability form (Exception = JN Yr 3 /4 umpires as above.)	
	All umpires must be accredited or be participating in our Umpire Training Program.	
	All umpires must have 2023 Netball Vic State Membership.	

COURT FEES per team

Year 3 & 4	\$210	Provide / pay own umpire every week
Year 5 – 9	\$350	Nominate an umpire for the panel (all paid by BNA) They must roster themselves to be available every week
	\$350 + \$125	No umpire provided for panel each week > must pay Umpire Levy
Year 10 +	\$290	Provide / pay an accredited senior umpire for 3 SENIOR games

TO ENTER:

- Independent and YEAR 3 teams must register via the BNA website link. Please see attached information.
